Knock-Out Finals Drama

All four of the Trophy finals have now started but so far only two have been decided. The Terrill final had a nail-biting finish after early results favourable to Warley Quinborne (2A) meant that South Birmingham (1A) needed to win the last three games to take the match. They duly dispatched two of WQ's remaining players, and with a 4 to 2 pawn advantage in the 3rd game South Birmingham seemed set for victory. However, they were frustrated at the eleventh hour when an apparently suicidal but accurately calculated series of moves by Quinborne player, Callum Gordon, led to him hoovering up his opponent's pawns to reach a drawn ending. So WQ had won the day by 4 ½ points to 4 and had also given SB's top team their only defeat of the season.

In the Barrington final Sutton Coldfield (4) defeated Northfield Checkmates 4 points to 2. The Townshend match is finely poised at Mutual Circle (4) 2 1/2 St. George's (4) 2 1/2 but with advantage to the Mutual player, Phil Wells, in the remaining game. In the Homer Shirley & Lucas (3B) lead Boldmere St. Michael's (2) 3 – 2 1/2 (including handicap) with two games adjourned. If S & L 'B' can gain one more point then this will cap a fine season for them as a battling performance in the League has already allowed them to tie with their own powerful 'A' team in the top half of Division Three.

Changes to the Morry-Wood Competition

There has been disquiet at the low number of entries for the Junior prize in the Morry-Wood competition. Last season the prize could not be awarded due to lack of entrants, and this year no entries had yet been received only two weeks before the closing date. Laurie Wheatley, Morry-Wood Chairman, proposed that juniors aged 11 or over should be allowed to put forward their own names for the prize. (In the past entrants had had to be nominated by an adult). This change to the rules was approved by the Committee. However, a second proposal that the eligibility conditions should be extended so as to allow applications from some juniors not connected with the BDCL (and/or not within its normal catchment area) was voted down. Other possible changes to the eligibility rules, such as widening the age limits, were discussed but did not meet with general approval. However, the Morry-Wood Committee would welcome any ideas as to how to encourage more good candidates to enter in future.

Penalties for Defaulted Games?

At the March meeting of the League Management Committee it was suggested that: (1) too many match-games were being defaulted in the League; and (2) that some clubs might be gaining advantage by listing players high up on their match cards in the full knowledge that these players were not going to turn up. No particular clubs or players were singled out. The issue was discussed and a consensus emerged that it was pointless to consider penalising individual *players*, but that it might be both feasible and desirable to bring in a new rule so that *Clubs* could be penalised if they repeatedly defaulted games on the higher boards. No decision on the matter was reached but the way was left open for someone to put forward concrete proposals on this issue at the next Annual General Meeting or Management Meeting.

In your editor's view it would certainly be a good idea to deter flagrant attempts to gain an unfair advantage. However, the situation is often more blurred than this. A team captain may sometimes be in doubt as to whether a certain player (say a Board 2) is going to arrive. The choices then are difficult. If the player is listed as normal and he fails to turn up, this is embarrassing and arguably fraudulent. However, if the captain leaves the player out then a game may be unnecessarily defaulted; and if he puts the player's name down on Board 6 then this could be a breach of rule 7.2. An unenviable choice.
